“ I just found out about Pam's passing up here in Indiana by way of text and phone call from my brothers and sister back in Arkansas late this afternoon. For me, it quickly became a profoundly sad day because I remember when a time -- in the early to mid-`70s when I was a grade schooler in Fordyce -- when Pam Kyzer, Joanne Kyzer (Jackie's mom) and Karen Hornaday (my mom) were very much the Big 3 of our extended Arkansas family. You never heard so much laughter and good vibes than when those three were holding court during a holiday get-together, the occasional picnic, fish fry, cookout, summer reunion or just a weekend (or weeknight) canasta session. For all intents and purposes, our families lives revolved around them (or softball) -- or both.

Goodness ... every one of them passed before their time, none of them making it even to what most folks consider "retirement age." By any normal measure, all three should still be here with us today. God had other plans. Yet indeed, they've left us lots of memories behind -- until we one day join them in the spiritual plane. I think it's an old German saying that goes something like: "Don't cry because it's over; smile because it happened." Or somesuch ...

I'll always remember Pam's pronounced Bearden accent (yes, Bearden folks have their own accent -- separate and distinct from other Southern dialects -- as Pam would often profess). I don't know that Pam actually was from Bearden or that she could just imitate Bearden folk quite well, but she had it down pat! Of course, Pam married my oldest cousin and a man I very much look up to (going back to my grade school years) in Jackie Kyzer -- and it was equally hilarious to listen to those two go back-and-forth. If couples truly are made for each other, certainly they were. My thoughts and prayers are with you, Jackie.

Leigh, I'll never forget everything you did for our family when our mom learned she had stage 4 lung cancer back in 2009 and had about 3 months to live. It's a proud testament to the kind of daughter Pam and Jackie raised. I very much wanted to be at the service on Saturday, but I only learned of Pam's passing about 2 hours ago and the visitation service is ongoing as I type this. So please forgive my lack of attendance.

Kyle, because of our age difference I haven't gotten to know you quite as well (though I WAS at your wedding :-). But know that my thoughts and prayers are also with you and your family as well. They are from ALL of us Hornaday cousins -- myself (who is getting up there at 53) out in Hoosierland (Bloomington, Ind.), Dan just outside White Hall (closer to Redfield really), Lori down in Crossett and Steve up in Maumelle.

God bless you Pam. I look forward to the day we will all meet -- and laugh together once again -- in a much more exalted place. But to cousins, relatives and friends, I warn. Beware. Be vigilant. If you think Pam, Joanne and Karen got to the pearly gates ahead of us and don't have some sort of chicanery planned, that presumption would be most unwise ...
